
Definition and Concepts

Promoting health

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Monitoring vital signs

Administrative medicine

03 Types of care







Definition

Home care refers to nursing services provided at the patient's home, typically by professional nurses or caregivers.

Service content

Advantages

Convenient and flexible, able to meet the personalized needs of patients while reducing the burden on hospitals.

Community nursing

Definition

Community nursing refers to the nursing services provided in the community environment, usually carried out by nurses or caregivers in collaboration with community resources.

Service content

including preventive healthcare, health education, chronic disease management, etc., aimed at improving the health level of community residents.

Advantages

It can integrate community resources, promote resident participation, and improve overall health levels.

Rehabilitation numbering



Definition

Rehabilitation nursing refers to the nursing services provided to patients with physical or psychological disabilities, aimed at helping them recover their function and ability to live independently.

Service content

including physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, as well as training and guidance on daily life skills.

Advantage

Able to develop personalized rehabilitation plans based on the specific situation of patients, promoting their comprehensive recovery.

Long term care

Definition

Long term care refers to the care services provided to patients who require long-term care, usually conducted in nursing homes or nursing homes.

Service content

including daily care, medical care, psychological support, etc., aimed at meeting the long-term needs of patients.
