Stuart Little is a 1999 live-action science-fiction comedy adventure film, based on a 1945 novel of the same name by E. B. White.

Stuart is a mouse but can speak like humans. Despite his little size, the talking white mouse is never afraid to be himself and try big things.

Alvin, Simon, and Theodore in *Alvin and the Chipmunks*

Alvin, Simon and Theodore are three mice in *Alvin and the Chipmunks*, a 2007 American live-action

musical comedy film. The tree that they live in is cut down and driven to Los Angeles. There, they meet David Seville, a struggling songwriter and composer, who has changed them into a very successful band of singers.

Remy in *Ratatouille*

Remy is a highly intelligent and idealistic young rat in the 2007 American computer-animated comedy film *Ratatouille*. With unusual senses of taste and smell, he dreams of becoming a chef like his idol (偶像), the late Auguste Gusteau.

A five-year-old dog named Kelsey has been praised as a hero for helping to save the life of her owner who slipped in the snow and broke his neck.

The man, Bob, was alone when he left his Michigan farmhouse on New Year's Eve to collect firewood.

Expecting a journey of only several meters, Bob was wearing just long johns (秋裤), a shirt and slippers when he went outside, although the temperature was around -4°C .

After the accident, he was unable to move in the snow. Fortunately, Kelsey came to his assistance.

"I was shouting for help, but my nearest neighbor is about 400 meters away, and it was 10:30 pm," Bob explained. "But my Kelsey came. By the next morning, my voice was gone and I couldn't yell for help, but Kelsey didn't stop barking."

Bob's companion kept him warm by laying on top of him. She licked his face and hands to keep him awake. "Kelsey kept barking but never left my side," Bob recalled. "She kept me warm. I knew I couldn't give up and that it was my choice to stay alive."

Bob spent 19 hours in the freezing cold. When he finally lost consciousness, his dog kept barking. Finally, hearing the barking, Bob's neighbor discovered him at 6:30 pm. On New Year's Day and called the emergency services at once. When Bob arrived in hospital, his body temperature was below 21°C . However, doctors were surprised to find that he didn't have any frostbite (冻疮). They believed it was because of Kelsey's determination to keep him warm. Dr. Chaim Colen, the doctor who treated Bob, said, "Animals can help and his dog really saved him...he was very fortunate."

Bob said he was "enormously" grateful for both Dr. Colen and his Kelsey. "They saved my life. They are truly heroes!"

Cancer researchers urged people on Wednesday to take more vitamin D to lower risk of cancer, saying studies showed a clear link. "Our suggestion is for people to increase their intake (吸入, 摄入), through diet or a vitamin supplement," Dr. Cedric Garland said in a telephone interview.

Garland's research team reviewed 63 studies, including several large long-term ones, on the relationship between vitamin D and certain types of cancer worldwide between 1966 and 2004. "There's nothing that has this ability to prevent cancer," he said, urging governments and public health officials to do more to fortify (增强) foods with vitamin D.

Garland is part of a University of California at San Diego Moores Cancer Center team that published its findings this week online in the *American Journal of Public Health*. Vitamin D is found in milk, as well as in some orange juice, yogurt and cheeses, usually at around 100 international units (IU) a serving.

"People might want to consider a vitamin supplement to raise their intake to 1000 IUs per day" Garland said, adding that it was well within the safety guidelines established by the National Academy of Sciences. The authors said that taking more vitamin D could be especially important for people living in northern areas, which receive less vitamin D from sunshine. "African Americans, who don't produce as much of the vitamin because of their skin colour, could also benefit significantly from a higher intake," the authors said.
