Lasting five months, the Singapore Biennale is a dynamic event that encourages folks to see art in a new light through interactive installations

Chinese scientists say they have developed a robotic fish that can remove

microplastic particles from water environments. Researchers working on the

project say the robots could help to clean up plastic pollution in oceans around the world.

The robotic swimmers are about 1.3 centimeters long. They are made of a soft chemical Compound. The robots are designed to absorb microplastics while moving through the water. The project was launched by a team at Sichuan University in

southwestern China. The researchers said the robots have already performed well in shallow water and they plan to carry out more tests in deeper waters. The

findings scientists reported their in a new study in Nano Letters. The comes from the American Chemical Society, a nonprofit organization publication by the U.S. Congress. The robotic supported fish were built to target microplastic particles, which are smaller than five millimeters. Studies have pollution confirmed that microplastic has been discovered in many natural environments. The material comes from the breakdown of manufactured plastic products and industrial waste.

"а The team said the robots can be controlled by light. Turning light laser " on and off causes the fish ' s tail to move back and near-infrared the American Chemical Society said. The robotic fish can swim up to 2.76 forth, body lengths per second. The researchers said this is faster than most similar ' s research team. soft robots. Wang Yuyan was a member of Sichuan University She told Reuters news agency that the small, lightweight robot is currently being used to collect microplastics for research purposes. But Wang added that the team plans to expand that use so the robot fish can remove larger amounts of microplastic waste from deep ocean areas. The fish can take in different kinds of microplastics and even repair itself when damaged, the researchers said. And if a robot fish is accidentally eaten by a real fish, it could safely digest the material, the team added. Dans le Noir, close to London 's financial district, is a restaurant full of blind waiters and waitresses whobecome your eyes around the restaurant, whose original Paris branch opened in 2004.

In the bar with the light, you choose whether you want the fish, meat or vegetable, but the dishes themselves remain a secret, as do the ingredients of the "surprise" cocktails. Bags, coats and devices(设备) that light up, including watches and mobile phones, are kept in the bar. It 's also a great chance to break social convention and eat using your fingers. Those same fingers are also the only way you can tell how much wine you' re pouring into your glass.

The happy atmosphere in the dining room also made the night memorable. You

can' t really avoid talking to the person next to you at the long tables and guessing what the dishes are certainly provides adequate fuel for the conversations.

All will be revealed at the end of the meal when you are led back out into

the lit bar. Not only do you finally get to see what you 've just been eating

but also who you ' ve been talking to for the last 90 minutes.
